Notes to the table of Funeral Fees 2010:

1. Cheques for fees other than verger's and organist's should be made payable to 'High Ongar PCC'.
2. Services/ committals at crematoria other than Chelmsford or Harlow may incur an additional travel fee.
3. Gravedigger's fees, where booked directly by the parish of High Ongar, will also be in addition to the above fees.
4. A detailed description of any monument, plaque or additional wording on an existing monument or plaque must be approved in advance by the Priest-in-Charge, the Revd Malcolm Peters, before any inscription or other work is commenced.
5. These fees are only for 2010. They are likely to rise in subsequent years.
